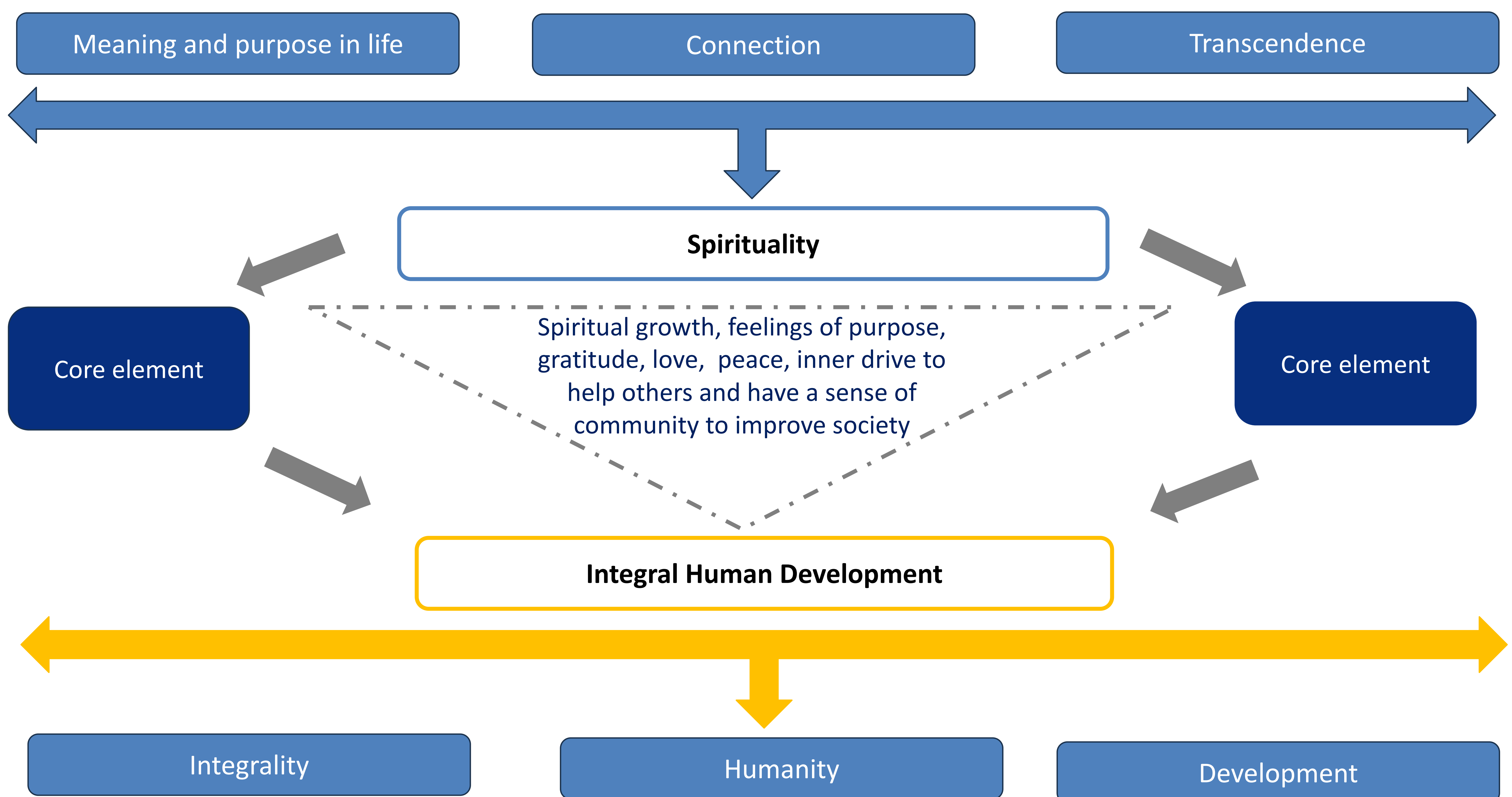
AIM: This research aims to emphasise the value of spirituality as a core component of the Integral Human Development concept and understanding.
