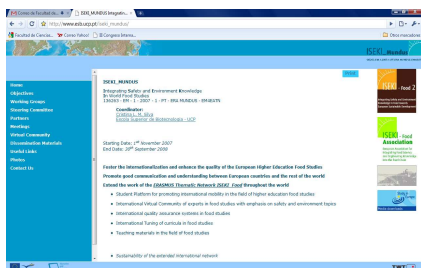
## ISEKI\_Mundus: Integrating Safety and Environment Knowledge In World Food Studies

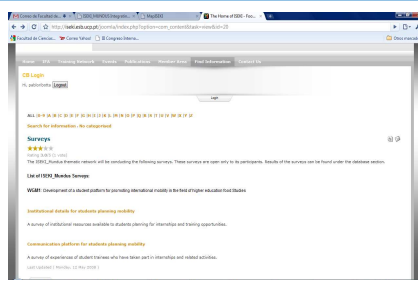

Creation of a virtual working environment for the ISEKI\_Mundus



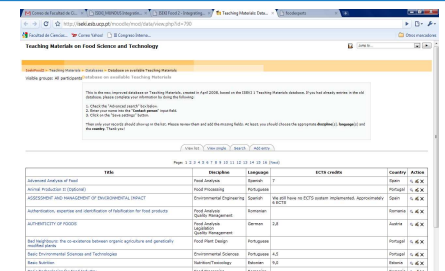

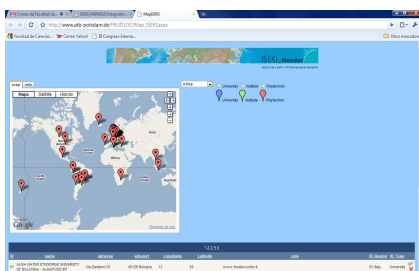

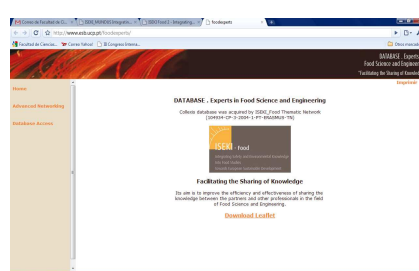
